Spring 2024 Watson Distinguished Visiting Professor in the Humanities: **Proposals due March 11, 2022**

- Proposed candidate's work should be renowned and meaningfully engage the humanities, broadly conceived.
- Residency should be designed to attract diverse audiences across campus and the community: it typically spans 2 weeks and combines formats, e.g., public lectures, workshops, exhibits, class visits, faculty or student dialogues.
- Proposals originate with faculty (teams or individuals) who, upon award serve as principal organizer, host, and point of contact for the Watson Professor.

2022-23 Humanities Center Dissertation Fellowships: **Applications due noon on Friday, February 11, 2022**

- Applicants must already have passed qualifying exams and/or prospectus defense and *demonstrate clear promise of **completing** their dissertation during the fellowship year.*
- Applicants must already be advanced to doctoral candidacy in one of the following Arts and Sciences departments: English, Philosophy, Religion, or Writing Studies Rhetoric and Composition.
- Fellows must be on campus during the academic year, meet regularly about their work, and participate in Humanities Center activities, including a public presentation about their research.
