Recurring! Faculty Creative Activities and Research (FCAR) Internal Grant Program. The FCAR program will provide up to \$5,000 for one-year projects to support research and creative endeavors in the humanities, arts, social sciences, and related fields and increase high-quality scholarly output by faculty. Please review the **Frequently Asked Questions** posted on the Office of Research website for additional information. Abstracts of prior FCAR projects may be found on the Office of Research Development's **SharePoint page** (login required). **Apply by October 15, 2025**.

Recurring! WRAP or Writing and Publishing. In partnership with the Humanities Center, WRAP supports faculty in "wrapping up" their single-author book projects. WRAP will help offset costs associated with the final stages of publication/production, when a book will soon appear in print or on digital platforms. Eligible areas are copy editing, indexing, permissions fees, open access book publication costs, and other subvention. WRAP funds awarded in Fall 2025 must be expended by the University before March 15, 2026. Apply by October 15, 2025.

Recurring! 2025-26 A&S Humanities Editorial Support (November – May 2026). Support for A&S humanities faculty to hire a developmental editor, an expert who provides high-level feedback on big-picture issues, or request other editorial support, e.g. to participate in specialized writing workshops, hire translation services, or other specialized holistic writing services. Apply by October 15, 2025.

Recurring! 2026-27 A&S/Maxwell Humanities Book Manuscript Workshop Program (for workshops held July 1, 2026 – May 15, 2027). This program enables pre-tenure assistant professors or tenured associate professors in the humanities division of the College of Arts & Sciences and Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs who are close to completing a book-length manuscript to benefit from a virtual discussion of their project by three senior, external scholars in their field. Apply by December 15, 2025.

Annual! Small Group Research Planning. November 2025 (2-part workshop).
